What Makes a 10kW Solar System Work?

How Eskom's Crisis Shapes Solar Adoption

Eskom's 15% price hike proposal for 2025 changes the game. Solar users now face:

"Bi-directional electricity charges" - fees for both drawing from and feeding into the grid

This policy, sort of a solar tax, makes battery storage crucial. Why sell power back at R0.87/kWh when you can store it for nighttime use worth R2.50/kWh?

In the Western Cape, farmers have created solar cooperatives. One group in Stellenbosch shares a 500kW system through smart metering. Could this model work for suburban complexes? Absolutely - it's already happening in Pretoria East.
