### Why Solar Energy Explodes in Kenya

5. Plan for expansion (Leave space for extra panels)

Pro tip: Time purchases with annual solar expos like Nairobi's Energy Week (October 2024) for exclusive deals.

Still unsure? Try the "Mobile Charger Challenge." Buy a small 10W panel to charge phones for a week. If it survives Kenya's weather mood swings (from Machakos sun to Nyahururu hail), you've found a reliable brand.
