Three critical installation factors for PE:

- Orientation away from prevailing sea winds
- Moisture-proof electrical components
- Load management for cloudy spells

Meet the Ngqele family in Walmer - their solar-plus-storage system paid off in 3 unexpected ways:

- R4,200 monthly electricity bill slashed to R387
- Increased home value (17% appraised bump)
- Side hustle charging neighbors' devices during outages

But here's what most installers won't tell you - proper maintenance doubles system longevity. I recommend quarterly checkups before seasonal weather shifts. Remember that September storm? Systems with clean panels and tight connections rode it out smoothly.

The "Sun Tax" Advantage

New municipal regulations effective October 2023 actually reward solar battery users. Feed excess power back during peak demand (4-7pm) and earn 1.8x the standard kWh rate. It's like turning your garage into a

mini power plant!
