Why Pretoria Needs Solar-Powered Car Charging

Connect the alligator clips to your battery terminals, ensuring polarity matches. The controller's LED should glow green within minutes. Pro tip: Use solar-compatible extension cables rated for outdoor use to avoid voltage drops.

The Real Cost of Going Solar

While initial investments range from ZAR 2,500 to ZAR 8,000, consider these savings:

Battery replacement Every 3 years 5+ years
