The Energy Crisis Hitting Home

You know that sinking feeling when load shedding hits during dinner prep? Pietermaritzburg residents endured 96 hours of blackouts last month alone. Eskom's aging infrastructure can't keep up with demand - national energy availability factors dropped to 52% this quarter, the worst since 2020.

But here's the kicker: Municipal electricity tariffs jumped 18.6% in July. At this rate, power bills could double by 2027. What if there's a way to freeze your energy costs while keeping the lights on?

The Hidden Costs of Grid Dependence

Let's crunch numbers. A typical Pietermaritzburg household using 900kWh/month now pays R2,300 monthly. With projected increases:

"Our solar array produced 112% of household needs last summer," reports Thando Ndlovu, a Scottsville early adopter. "We've not paid an electricity bill in 8 months."
